

# Ditsy Daisy Chain Necklace



## Materials

- 8TR761 : A (White Seed Bead)
- 8TR47D : B (Green Seed Bead)
- HH291 : C (Yellow Pearl)
- F200 : Extension Chain  
Clasp and Jumpings
- White beading thread
- Beading needle



Learn how to make this pretty daisy chain necklace or wrap bracelet. This design is so easy to adapt and create to the length you would like!

*TIP: Using Fireline (TC301) or Wildfire (W473) will make a 'firmer' chain and will need less re-enforcement due to them being much stronger and stiffer threads.*

### Step 1:

Thread your needle with approx 1.5 metres of thread and pick up 3A and 1B. Leaving a 10 inch tail, go back (in the same direction) through all 4 beads so that your needle is exiting out of the B bead. Pull the seed beads into a circle and knot.

### Step 2:

Pick up 10A and go back through the A bead added in step 1. Pick up 1C. Including the A bead your thread is exiting, skip back 6A beads and pass down through the 7th A bead.

### Step 3:

Pick up 3B and go back through the A bead in the same direction to form a circle. Go through the next 2B beads so that your thread is exiting out of the middle B bead. Pick up 1B, 1A and 1B and go back through the B bead your thread is exiting again to make a circle. Go back through the next two seed beads so that your thread is exiting from the A bead.

### Step 4:

Repeat steps 2 and 3 to your desired length.

Pick up 3B and go back through the last A bead added. Work back along your bead path and tie off. Thread on the 10 inch tail leftover from the beginning and again, work back along your bead path and tie off.

### Step 5:

Thread another approx 1.5 metres of thread. Following your bead path, re-enforce the entire length to strengthen and firm up the chain. Pay particular attention to the last flower and triangle at each end.

### Step 6:

Thread a jump ring through the triangle at one end of the chain and close. Ensure it is tightly closed to prevent your thread slipping through. Add another jump ring and clasp. At the other end, add the extension chain before closing the jump ring.
